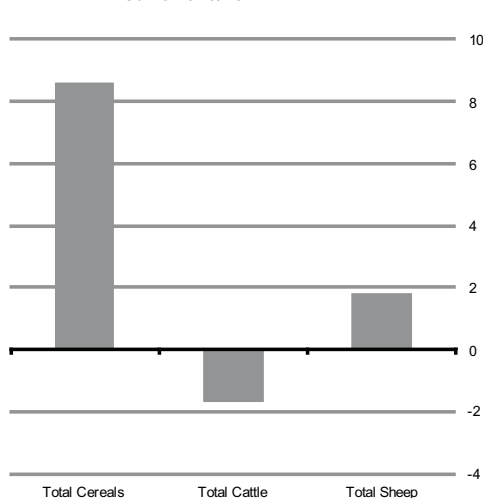

Area under cereals up 8.6% in June 2011

The final results for June 2011 show that the area under cereals increased by 23,500 hectares (+8.6%) to 297,400 ha. There was an increase in each of the main cereals, with the area under wheat increasing by 16,300 ha (+21.0%), the area under oats increasing by 1,700 ha (+8.6%) and the area under barley increasing by 5,800 ha (+3.3%). *See Table 1.*

The results also indicate that the total number of sheep increased by 84,500 (+1.8%) to 4,829,950 in June 2011. This was mainly due to an increase of 105,100 (+4.7%) in other sheep (non-breeding). *See Table 2.*

A comparison with the June 2010 results indicates that:

- ◆ Cattle numbers decreased by 113,600 (-1.7%) to 6,493,000. There were reductions of 86,900 (-11.4%) in male cattle 1 to 2 years, 80,600 (-15.9%) in male cattle 2 years and over, 35,100 (-3.0%) in other cows and 10,200 (-19.6%) in bulls. *See Table 2.*
- ◆ Pig numbers increased by 32,700 (+2.2%) to 1,549,000. The number of breeding pigs decreased by 3.3% while the number of non-breeding pigs increased by 2.8% in the same period. *See Table 2.*
- ◆ The area under potatoes decreased by 15.1% to 10,400 ha. *See Table 1.*

A regional analysis of the livestock numbers indicates that the largest number of cattle (1,307,500) was in the South-West region, the largest number of sheep (1,278,700) was in the West region and the largest number of pigs (431,300) was in the Border region. *See Tables 4 & 5.*

Diagram 1 : Numbers of total cattle and sheep in each region, June 2011

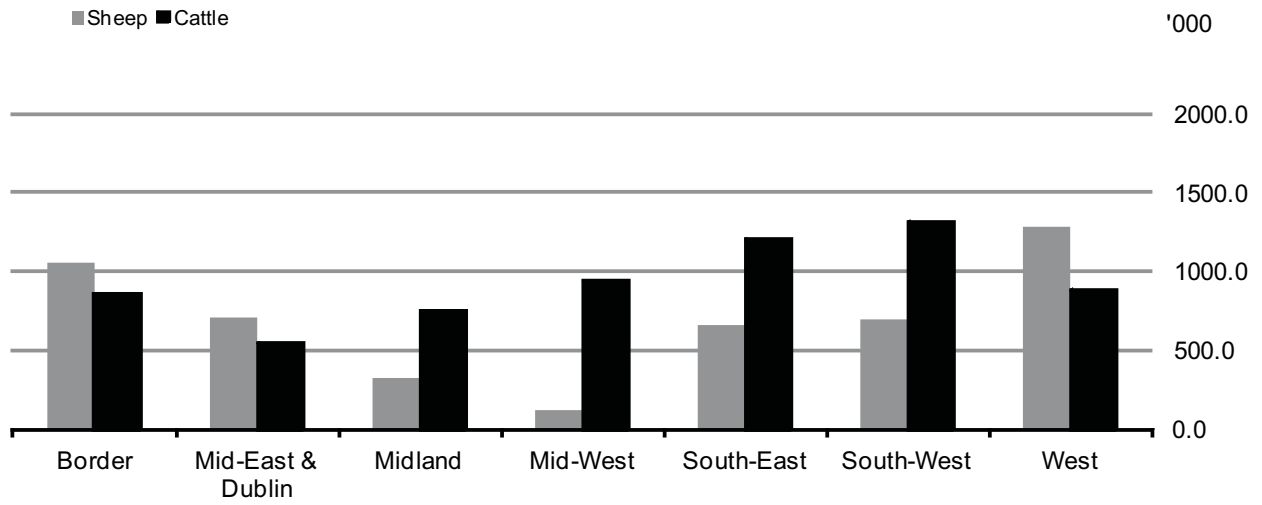


Diagram 2 : Change in areas under certain crops, June 2010 - 2011

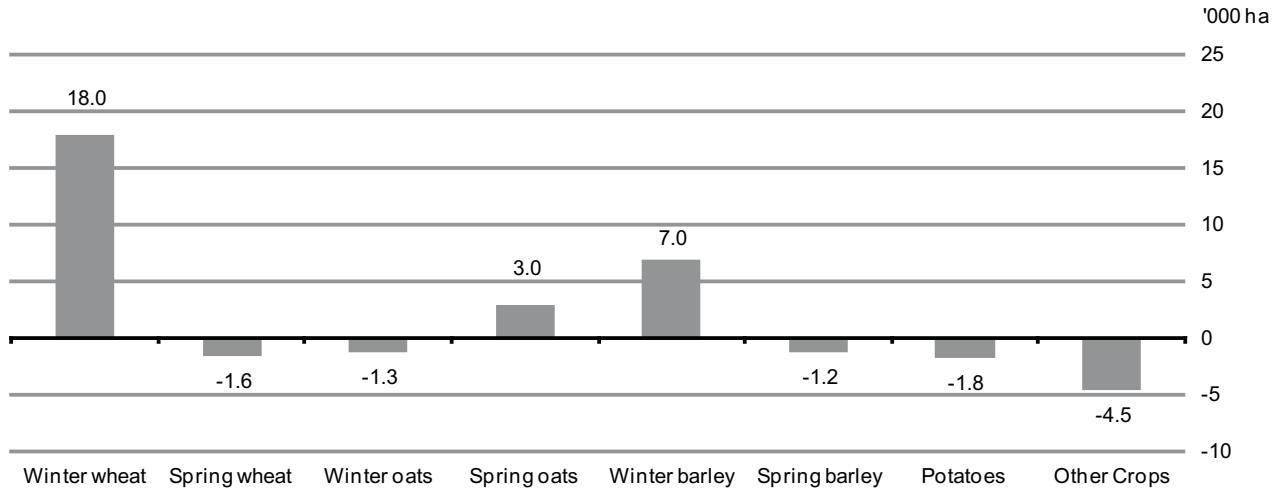

Background Notes

Introduction This release presents final estimates of land utilisation and livestock numbers in June 2011 at State and regional level. The estimates for sheep and pigs are based on returns from the 2011 June sample survey of agricultural holdings and the June 2011 Pig Survey conducted by the Central Statistics Office (CSO). The estimates for cattle and for crops are obtained from administrative data from the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM). The results for 2010 are the final estimates based on the 2010 Census of Agriculture.

Coverage Farms where the agricultural area used was at least one hectare (2.47 acres) are included in the June Agricultural Sample Survey. Farms with less than one hectare may also be included if they were engaged in intensive production.

Results **Crops:** The results for crops are based on data obtained from the DAFM Single Payment Scheme.

Cattle: The results for cattle are obtained from DAFM's Animal Identification and Movement (AIM) system, formerly known as the Cattle Movement Monitoring System (CMMS). This system was introduced at the beginning of 2000 and involves electronically recording data on animal movements. Information on cattle numbers and on flows into and out of the cattle population has been available from this system since December 2002

Sheep: The June 2011 results for sheep are based on the trends obtained by comparing the returns from the 2011 sample with the 2010 returns for the same 14,900 farms and applying these trends to the June 2010 figures.

Pigs: A specialist pig survey was conducted by the CSO due to the intensive nature of this activity.

As the figures in the text and tables have been rounded to the nearest 100 units, there may be slight discrepancies between the sum (or difference) of the constituent items and the total shown. Percentage changes have been calculated on actual figures.
